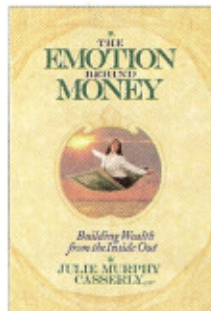

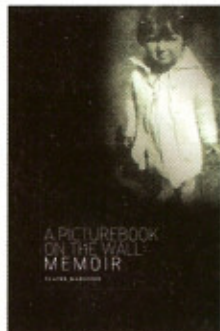


The Emotion Behind Money

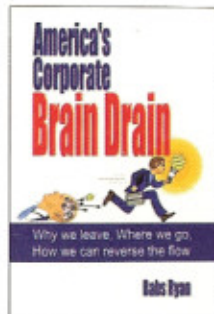


A Picture Book on the Wall: Memoir

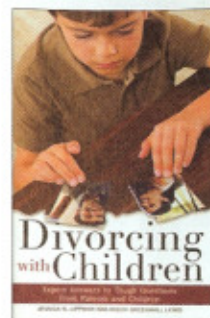


America's Corporate Brain Drain
